

The regular meeting of the Town Assembly of Arden was held on January 22, 1962 at the Guild Hall with Trustee Waw presiding.

The minutes of the September meeting were read and approved.

The financial statement of the Trustees was read and approved. A copy is on file.

Trustee Waw reported that the bank account was very low and that the Trustees did not have any special business to report at present.

Civil Committee reported that the swimming pool has been made into a skating rink. The dam breast has been lowered and the water is shallow. Mr. Vander has new equipment for snow removal.

The committee report was accepted.

Assessors report by Henry Aughey. Gordon Greig has moved from the area; therefore there are only six assessors this year. The previous Board of Assessors had the unfinished business of assessing for the sewer taxes but this cannot be done until the sewers are assured and the cost ascertained.

As there were no nominations from the floor, the committee report was accepted.

Water and Sewer Committee reported that new bids are being prepared. The curbs will not be replaced. Almost all residents with hedge reference agreed that they would not have to be replaced.

The Committee's report was accepted with thanks for the work accomplished. Safety Committee report was presented by Marie Berger. Massmurder as the State Police requested that Sherwood Road from Marsh to Hillside be one way. Mr Ponte has been asked to permit the Safety Committee to put a one-way sign on his building so that people parking there must enter Marsh or Hunch Road from Sherwood. It has been called to the Safety Committee attention that many people ignore the one way sign on the road. The report was accepted.

School Trustees report progress.

The Registration Committee considered a election to replace the vacancy in the Budget Committee caused by Jordan Gregg moving from Order. He had one year remaining to serve. The Advisory Committee had nominated Woodrow Vandenberg and Warren Day. The Registration Committee reported Woodrow Vandenberg elected.

Under very business the question of house to house peddlers and magazine salesmen was discussed. Some of these people have been offensive. It was thought that putting up signs stating "No Peddler Allowed" might help. Some are suggested that all salesmen be issued a permit. If a salesman refuses to leave you can call the police. A motion was made and passed that this issue be tabled permanently.
