

The regular meeting of the Town Assembly was held in the Eld Hall on January 25, 1954 with Trustee Wain presiding.

After a quorum was declared present the minutes of the November meeting were read and accepted.

A communication from the State Board of Health thanking us for our cooperation during the time of the state wide X-ray survey was read.

The trustee's financial report was read and accepted. A copy is on file.

Mr. Albee Willson reported for the Civic Committee: Following the motion to contact our attorneys concerning the overflow of water down Sherwood Road from the water tank, Mr. Cohen sent a letter to the water Co. outlining the damage being done and a copy of this letter was sent to the Public Service Commission. The Water Co. replied to the letter that they would be willing to repair the road but could not put a gauge on the tank that would shut it off when it became full. They state that they are planning to construct a new tank soon. A Mr. Harry Davis of the Public Service Commission has been contacted by Mr. Willson and he wants to make a complete survey of the situation with the Civic Committee. The planned meeting had to be postponed because of snow but he will be contacted again very soon.

The Robert's drain is complete with the exception of last wiring connection but it is to be installed in couple of days. The drain part Aughey taking water from Sherwood Road will be

constructed as soon as weather permits.

Registration Committee reported 401 votes.  
There were no reports from the other Town Assembly  
Committees.

Under new business: George Deaver was  
nominated to serve out Robert Voris' term on  
the Civic Committee. The secretary was  
instructed to cast a ballot electing them.

The following people were nominated  
to serve on the Civic Committee two of whom  
will be elected at the March meeting.

Albee Willemans, Oliver Hony, Michael Jaffe.  
Frank Cornell has resigned from office; therefore  
he cannot serve on the board of assessors. The  
By-Laws Committee has been asked to consider  
an amendment to the By-Laws that will correct  
this situation.

A motion was made and passed that  
the following suggested amendment be made to  
the By-Laws: If an elected assessor for some  
reason or other cannot serve, that the person  
receiving the next highest number of votes  
should take his place.

A motion on the meeting adjourned.
