

The regular meeting of the Town Assembly was held on March 23, 1959 with Trustee Wase presiding.

After a quorum was declared present the minutes of the January meeting were read and approved.

Trustee report Philip Cohen reported that a bill is being presented to the general Assembly that will permit placing liens against each leaseholder for sewers. There are many technical difficulties to be overcome. One thing is that each leasehold must be identified as a recorded plat of land. We have never had a survey of that kind in Arden. The matter is being pushed as fast as possible. The financial report of the trustees was read and a copy is on file. The report of the trustees was accepted.

Civic Committee report by Albee Willoughby reported that we will have to raise cost of seats per seat to \$6.00 for adults, $\frac{1}{2}$ for children from 6 to 16 and $\frac{1}{3}$ for guest seats. We have a bid for spraying elm trees twice for \$300. It was pointed out that the first spray in April is to control bark beetle and a drenching spray. The second spray in July is for leaf beetle. The parking lot will be filled and leveled somewhat. The report is accepted.

Board of Assessors: Mr. Aughey elected Chairman and Thomas Furman elected secretary.

The Registration Committee sent out 383 referendum ballots for vote on sewers.

A motion was made and passed that copy of referendum be sent to all leaseholders.

Advisory Committee reported that most of its business has been covered by report of Committee. One request made is that the Trustees formulate a way that land can be subdivided in Arden.

Water & Sewer Committee requested that ballots come in quickly.

No report from Community Planning Budget, Audit Committee, Safety Committee or By-Laws. The report on special committee honoring Harry Vandever sadly reported that Mr Vandever had died before anything could be planned for him. Mr. Mrs. Liberman may be requested to draft a resolution honoring him. It has been suggested that a memorial plaque be erected in the Memorial Garden or some other suitable place. A tree is being planted in his memory by the Merry-go-Rounders.

Under old business, a letter from Mr. Gerster was read concerning a request made in January concerning whether fire insurance rates can be reduced in Arden. Mr. Gerster's letter indicated that nothing can be done until water pressure is increased in Arden.

Patricia Press was nominated to serve as Chairman of the Advisory Committee. The secretary was instructed to cast a ballot electing her.

May Moly was nominated to serve as Town Assembly Secretary. The secretary was instructed to cast a ballot electing her.

The Registration Committee conducted the election of the committee nominated at the January meeting. The results of the election are as follows:

Jane Angley reported that at the December
 Council of Civic Organizations, the police
 facilities were discussed at length and a
 report made that they were entirely
 inadequate. A committee was set up to
 study the situation. It is urged that
 people write to Colonel Jehu Ferguson
 Commanding officer of the State Police at
 Dover requesting that the Perry Hill Police
 be provided with adequate facilities.
 Her motion was made and passed that
 Jane Angley draft this letter and send
 it to Col. Ferguson and to the congressmen
 in the district.

The meeting in motion adjourned.
