

The regular meeting of the Town Assembly of Arden was held on March 27, 1967 with Trustee Wan presiding.

After a quorum was declared present the minutes of the January meeting and special March ~ 1967 meeting were read and after correction was made approved.

The financial report of the trustees was read and approved and a copy is on file.

The trustee filed a petition with the Court of Chancery to permit the trustee to convey to the incorporated Village of Arden the right of way on all streets. The petition will be heard on April 17 and notice will be posted at the Gold Hall, Mullin - Cherry Lane and Wind Lane and Hillside Road informing the residents of the hearings in the Court of Chancery.

The trustees would like to present a formal deed + agreement of transfer to the Chancellor. They have contacted John P Lewis who is the leading land conveyer in the area.

A motion was made and passed that the Town Assembly approve the selection of John P Lewis to draw the deed whereby the rights of way of the roads of Arden are transferred from the trustee of Arden to the incorporated Village of Arden.

Avic Committee reported all necessary work has been done. The Chairman Alben Williams reported the budget items expended.

Mr Robert Kommel cited the fact that is difficult during heavy snow storms to get through the Arden Post until they are plowed. He made a suggestion that during emergency snow periods that the roads

legendary to the Gold Hall parking lot be plowed first and that the lot be plowed so that residents could park their cars there until their own road was opened. It was suggested that this plan be adopted and referred to the Civic Committee.

No report from Assessor, Budget & Auditing Committees

Community Planning Committee requested that residents place garbage in cans and not just paper bags because dogs dig the refuse all over town.

Registration Committee reported that all items of the Budget approved at the January Town Assembly were approved. 26% of the 364 eligible voters voted but the Registration Committee had to contact 193 voters before enough ballots were received to count them. The report was accepted with thanks for the work that Patricia Pease has done on the committee.

The By-Law Committee appointed by the Chairman after the January Town Assembly is: I. B. Finkelstein, Chairman, Henry Aulhey, Carolyn Liberman, Shaul Glodstone, Murray Lashby, Joseph Rosenthal and Hamilton O'Ware and May Morley *ex officio*.

The proposed change is a referendum to changing required rates to appear a referendum to be changed by majority of residents to majority of those voting.

The Committee has met but it is not possible to present a final report now.

Safety Committee reported that the Safety Code passed by the Town Assembly at the September, 1966 was referred to the Commissioners of the Village of Arden for action. Upon advice of Counsel the Commissioners decided the code was lacking in legal substance and referred it to the Safety Committee for further action.

The Committee has studied many other codes and has prepared a 60 page Safety code. It was felt this is too long to read at the meeting and it was suggested that copies be placed in the Arden Library for study.

A motion was made and passed that copies be filed in the Library and that the March meeting be recessed until reconvened by the Chairman of the meeting to discuss the proposed Safety Code.

The School Trustees reported a referendum will be held April 11 to request a increase in school tax to enable the trustees of the school to hire a fourth teacher and provide additional teaching material.

The Registration Committee conducted the election of members of the Standing Committees who were nominated at the January meeting. The following were elected:
